Elevating Dr. Malone's Restorative Dentistry Practice

Like many great decisions, my decision to purchase an Orascoptic product for the first time was made on a golf course amongst friends. I've been practicing general and cosmetic dentistry for nearly 45 years now and what prompted me to make the switch was my friends' mention of the concept of EyeZoom – a loupe where I could change my magnification power without changing my glasses. I was sold. For the past decade, I had been consistently using three pairs of glasses while working on just one patient.

I would begin the anesthesia process using a 2.5x, then swapped that out for a 4x to complete my preliminary preparation and would finish using a pair of 5.5xs to finish the margins. At the time, using the optimal magnification power for each of those procedures meant stopping to change both my gloves and glasses between each step, which was very disruptive to my restorative process.

With EyeZoom, I'm able complete a typical tooth colored restorative process from start to finish using that loupe alone, with more swiftness and efficiency than I ever imagined possible. I administer anesthesia and place the rubber damn using 3x magnification, switch to 4x for the preparation phase and bump it up to 5x to conclude the finishing of the margins or preparation.

I find myself utilizing all three levels of magnification that the EyeZoom has to offer for almost every preparation procedure, whether that's a posterior composite, a veneer case or posterior crowns. EyeZoom is crucial component in the arsenal of any dentist dealing with tooth-colored aspects of dentistry.
